Nancy Waters: Since March, I have been doing a lot of miniatures in 1:24 scale. One project is French Chantilly Shop with an Art Nouveau Residence above it by Shannon May (Red Cottage Miniatures) on Etsy.

Since I bought a new Cricut Maker this summer, I made some 3-D wall and ceiling graphics using art nouveau shapes as my inspiration. This is my first experience with paper cutting machines; however, I design my projects in Adobe Illustrator (.svg files) and cut out card stock in Cricut Maker. To achieve thicker parts, I cut out several layers of my projects and glue



together. As an example, the balustrade is 4 or 5 layers thick. Pictured is the Chantilly Shop Facade and a portion of the shop with the clocks I created. In the bedroom, I made an Art Nouveaushaped bas relief wallpaper for the back wall. The furniture is by Half Scale Miniatures, Arjen Spinhoven designer and owner (on Etsy).

The Front Porch kit is designed by Janny Warnaar of Artofmini.com. Made of particle board, it was cut by a laser.


The American Gothic couple was purchased from Carla Gaustad and made in England.

The potted plants to left of door were created by Era Pearce of Pearce Miniatures in Arizona. I fell in love with this kit as I was surfing Art of Mini a few years ago. It took me back to another time and place. I knew that I had to have it. So, I ordered it and several of the furniture kits that Janny used in the display. Upon arrival I carefully labeled each piece and grouped them. Time went by as I stressed over paint issues and real life demands. After seeing Janny do a paint demonstration at a Chicago show, I gained a better understanding of her painting techniques and then went on search for the paints she used. The painting and the distressing were the most time consuming parts as I mixed different kinds of paint and then got to build muscles by sanding, sanding, sanding, sanding, sanding.



Like all of Janny's kits, everything fit perfectly. I'm not sure it would be completed now if we had not all been sequestered last year. Miniatures are definitely a cure for the Covid blues. I get pleasure each time I look at it. Because the American Gothic couple have been waiting forever to have a place in my collection, I have named the miniature Remember the Sabbath. They fit perfectly in the double rocker, pitchfork and milking pails have been set aside. It is a day of rest.
