I have always liked little things since I was a small child. I received my first dollhouse when I was 5 years old that was hand built by my uncle and

grandparents and still have to this day.

When I was able to get my dollhouse in my own room in my senior year of high school, this started my focus on miniatures for the dollhouse and as my hobby as my lifetime to date. Plus, I was able to incorporate all the arts and crafts stuff I like to do into my miniatures.

I have taken various classes over the years from local miniaturists as well as at Houseparties.

I have taught classes to our local club and State Days. Some of the classes were: Quarter scale mini scene in teacup; One inch scene corner room box; flower angels; mini quarter scale Christmas tree decorating; One inch Southwestern inside outside scene; Steampunk dress form; Paperclay exterior decorating; and Quarter scale room scene.

The best thing I learned was making porcelain miniature dolls and figurines with Betty Neiswender of Keramos Ceramics. She took me on to help her miniature business, teaching me how to pour, clean, fire, paint, string, dress and wig the mini dolls and figurines. We worked together at various miniature shows during the 80s and early 90s on the west coast and wholesaled to miniature shops around the world. It is always fun to discover one of her handcrafted porcelain items in other people's collections. I have many fond memories in making those minis and learning about selling miniatures with her.

My favorite piece in my collection is the quarter scale scene in a teacup. As this was my first attempt at making this and the teacup was from my grandmother's things I inherited. So, I wanted to save the teacup since it was cracked and made it into a scene. Ultimately my club liked how it came out and they asked me to teach it for a State Day, which I did.

My favorite websites are NAME, create.org, Quarter Connection, and the so many other wonderful mini websites I keep discovering and shopping at.

I have held offices in both NAME Clubs I have belonged to ~Las Vegas Miniature Enthusiasts, as I was one of the founding members, and now Albuquerque Mini Makers. I also was Regional Coordinator for N1 2010 to 2011 and currently State Rep for New Mexico and had been State Rep for Nevada 2009 – 2010.

Having fun sharing the joy of making and collecting miniatures has been the best part of my life. It has gotten me through joyful moments and heart-breaking moments. As I focus on planning, preparing, and completing a miniature item or project I find comfort, joy and peace as I create something that is unique in a tiny scale. It is something that reflects our everyday items or lifestyle in a miniature world. I have been blessed to learn from so many other miniaturists not only locally but from around the world. Learning every day on how to best accomplish a wonderful work of miniature art for others to see and learn to appreciate.


The N-1 Newsletter is published quarterly. <u>All members of N.A.M.E. are welcome</u> to submit contributions.
