When it comes to miniatures, there's no limit to your imagination. Consider what you currently have in your mini stash, the depth of the box, and colors in the original trim on the box. As you can tell I was into "decorating" mannequins for these boxes. I used wallpaper/design paper to compliment the box and theme. It's fun to add additional flourishes, artificial flowers, lace, framed pictures, furniture, etc. to finish the theme and compliment the wallpaper/design paper. I usually finish the floor with "carpet" or a rug

plus baseboard. Also, combining several scales is fun which you can easily do with these vignettes. So next time you want to create a wonderful vignette, use that cigar box.

Once again, we are fortunate to welcome our snowbird, Ginger Landon Siegel, who offered us a workshop creating ferns in pots.
















Works in progress! What fantasy can you create?


